## Ward pot allocation

As in previous years, it is proposed that £10,000 for each ward is top sliced from the total Wellbeing budget. In light of the overall reduction on the Wellbeing budget, Members of the committee are asked to consider whether they would want this top sliced amount to remain at £10,000 per ward. It is also proposed that £500 for each ward is top sliced from the ward allocations for the provision of community skips for community clean-ups and environmental projects.

# **Community Engagement**
