10mins	Explain that people don't always lose their money if they are scammed. Scams should be reported: to Action Fraud, to the bank etc.	PowerPoint Slides		
	Discuss how they feel now about spotting scams on websites, emails and when they suspect people are selling fake goods. Would they know what to look for? Would they know what to do?
