Those who felt unsafe were more likely to have been a victim of crime and perceived that anti-social behaviour was a problem. There was a general correlation between negative responses and higher levels of deprivation (Indices of Multiple Deprivation). - Leeds responses were compared with responses from other West Yorkshire districts. Leeds feedback was the second most positive within West Yorkshire Police force (West Yorkshire responses at district level ranged from 74% to 84%). High volume ASB incident categories are detailed in the table. Youth nuisance represented a high but reducing proportion of incidents, (5,122 youth nuisance incidents reported, reducing from 6,964 in the previous period). 1,828 ASB cases were closed (resolved) by the multi-agency Leeds Anti-social Behaviour team. High volume closed case types are detailed in the table. Noise nuisance represented a high proportion of caseload; caseload categorised as ‘violence’ increased by 6%.
